2012 Stan Hardy Award

The judging of the papers for the Stan Hardy Award is complete, and the winner has been determined. The winning paper – "Reducing Customer Dissatisfaction: How Important is

Learning to Reduce Service Failure?" – was authored by Michael A. Lapré, Owen Graduate School of Management, Vanderbilt University. It appeared in *Production and Operations Management* (Vol. 20, No. 4, pp. 491-507). The paper was selected based on its current relevance and contribution to the field of Operations Management (OM), its practicality and contribution to industry practice, and its rigor, creativity and readability. The award will officially be presented at this year's Midwest DSI Annual Meeting, on April 13th, 2012, in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

According to the Midwest DSI Bylaws, the President-elect convenes the Stan Hardy Award Committee to select the outstanding paper published in the OM field during the preceding year to receive the Stan Hardy Award at the annual meeting of the Midwest Region. This committee polls the editors of the following academic journals in OM and asks them to provide the top two OM articles published in their journals during the most current year: *Decision Sciences Journal, International Journal of Production Research, Journal of Operations Management, Manufacturing and Service Operations Management,* and *Production and Operations Management.* The committee, then, evaluates these articles and selects the Stan Hardy Award winner.
