MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS 2007/2008

A minimum of 2.0 grade is required for each course in each major. Freshmen pre-business and undecided business students admitted under this catalog year are not eligible to take any 300- or 400-level SBA courses without major standing in the business school (Economics courses excepted). Transfer students admitted into this catalog year should see an adviser for Core course restrictions. (See separate checklists for the B.A. and B.S. in Economics.)

GENERAL MANAGEMENT

These electives must be chosen from courses numbered 300 or higher and at least 6 credits must be at the 400 level. A student may not double major in general management and another major in the SBA, but other combinations are allowed. See catalog for available minors.
