MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS

A 2.0 is required for each course in each major. Pre-business and undecided business students are not eligible to take any 300- or 400-level SBA courses with the exception of ACC 310, ECN 303, FIN 322, MIS 300, MKT 302, ORG 330 and POM 343.
